We are collaborating with the catholic institution called Donbosco Pavur. 30 of our kids are participating with 52 local kids. We work in Tamil and Kanada - two languages.

It has been wonderful to see the healing process of our kids and it's amazing to see their growth in the past three days. We'll have the camp fire today. Our volunteers are doing a great job. It has been a great learning for Jess and Priya.

I am very happy to share this wonderful news that all our children sat for the +2 exams (A level) have passed. This e-mail confirms the high esteem in which the Vidiyal project is held.

I would like to share this story with you. Day before yesterday there was a news item in the dailies that a Mexican women got murdered here near Madurai by her own husband. They have a little girl called Adela. Police called day before yesterday to hand over the child to us. We were awake till 11.00 pm but they didn't bring the girl. We were told at 11 pm that they would bring her the next day.

Yesterday Adela was handed over to us for care and protection. It was a overwhelming experience for us but we have taken this very serious to give best care and protection to this girl. Of course you know that we give this to every child but being a foreign national child it became a bigger responsibility. Every one in Madurai was in praise of our work but we kept a low profile just to keep the child safe from media intrusion.

It took some time for us to build rapport with her and it was painful to see her in tears. Sharmi spent a lot of time till very late in the night and consoled her and made her to sleep. Today morning she looked much better. Preethi (one of the older girls) also supports Sharmi in looking after the child. Today Mr. Veladimir from the Mexican embassy came and spent about two hours talking to me. He also interacted with Adela. His testimony "Adela is in the right hands. We were very anxious about her safety but now we know that she is in the hands of good people and with a good organization" Great! Praise be with the lord.

Kindly remember us in your prayers as this is a new situation that we are in. We are proud for given this responsibility but at the same time stressed with the safety of the child. May God give us the wisdom to provide the best appropriate care to Adela.

Thanks again for being very close to our hearts to hear our anxiety. Adela's grand parent is travelling from Mexico to take her grand daughter back home. But this requires lot of legalities. Kindly pray for the smooth process of the legal formalities so that the child can go to her home country without any delay.

About a fortnight later Jim wrote:

It gives me great pleasure sharing this happy news with you. Adela the Mexican girl who was given in our custody has been restored to her paternal grandmother Monica. It was such a moving occasion for every one of us including our children. I and Sharmila had a great satisfaction and over whelming joy on this occasion. Thanks for your prayers. Every one was in praise of Vidiyal and its work. Praise be with the Lord.

10th Standard examination results

This is the First board exam children write which is equivalent to GCSE exam in the UK. This exam is conducted for a total of 500 marks (Each subject carries 100 marks). This is the first batch of students who studied under the equity education syllabus in Tamil-Nadu.
